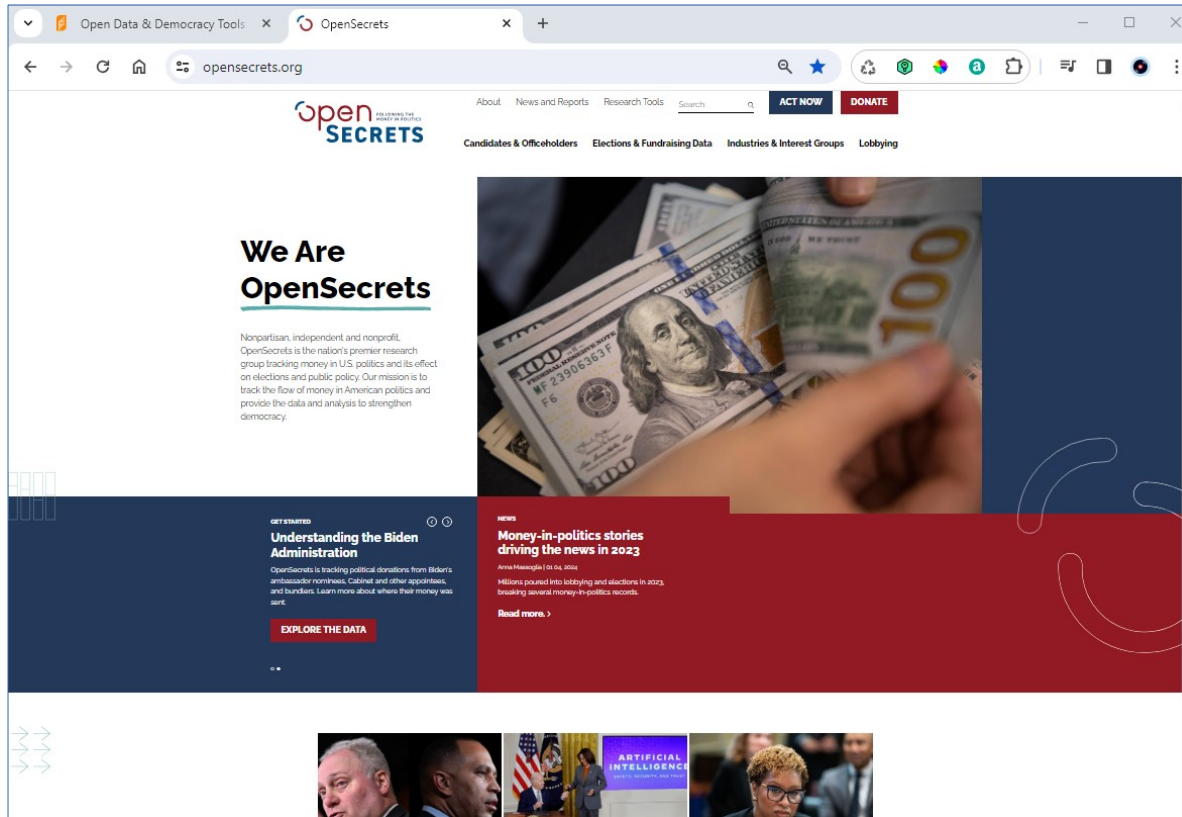

- Michigan SB 464**: Vehicles; registration plates; legacy license plates; create. Amends sec. 803r of 1949 PA 300 (MCL 257.803r) & adds sec. 803s. THE WHOLE, TRANSPORTATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE, TRANSPORTATION, MOBILITY, AND INFRASTRUCTURE 2023-2024 REGULAR SESSION
- Michigan SB 277**: Land use; farmland and open space; continue PA 116 enrollment; allow for farmland during deferral period of use for commercial solar facilities. Amends secs. 36101 & 36104c of 1994 PA 431 (MCL 324.36101 & 324.36104c) & adds secs. 36104c & 36104c. THE WHOLE, ENERGY AND ENVIRONMENT, ENERGY, COMMUNICATIONS, AND TECHNOLOGY 2023-2024 REGULAR SESSION


